The defendants Commonwealth of Massachusetts and Secretary of the Commonwealth William Francis Galvin in his individual and official capacities (collectively "the Massachusetts Defendants") move to dismiss the complaint against them on the same grounds asserted in the motions to dismiss and accompanying memoranda filed by Oregon (Doc. No. 22) and South Carolina (Doc. No. 23): lack of personal jurisdiction, Eleventh Amendment immunity, and improper venue (South Carolina only). The Massachusetts Defendants further note that plaintiffs' Amended Complaint fails to allege any facts specifically relating to activities of the Massachusetts Defendants, in New York or otherwise. See generally Doc. No. 21.

Rather than filing a duplicative memorandum, the Massachusetts Defendants adopt and join in the arguments asserted in the above-referenced motions and memoranda and respectfully request the corresponding relief: dismissal of the complaint as to the defendants Commonwealth of Massachusetts and Secretary of the Commonwealth William Francis Galvin in his individual and official capacities.
